

Targeting, Infiltration & and Journalistic_Terrorism



Ninety-four million clicks just for one post from Prince Reza Pahlavi. And in the millions-strong referendums and tens of thousands of deaths, Iran voted for him as their leader.

The infiltration and penetration of Allah's complex intelligence and counterintelligence organization in the world is the main factor in the persistence of terrorism.

Siyavash Awesta has on several occasions been the victim and target of campaigns of journalistic and economic terrorism attributed to networks linked to Iran's fundamentalist ruling power. According to numerous testimonies and media sources, these networks — now infiltrated under multiple identities and masks — operate discreetly and in compartmentalized structures, at a level such that even certain Western intelligence services struggle to identify them and map their structures.

Here is only one example of an act of journalistic terrorism:

Divide and Rule and Multicolored Infiltrated Agents in Every Hole

Two French citizens of Iranian origin have revealed important information about the infiltration of spies from the Islamic regime of Iran.



The regime of the mullahs, through “New Rome”-type projects and in coordination with Russian and British leaders, is seeking to sow division within the ranks of Prince Reza Pahlavi by using four historical anti-Iranian currents

and factions. Although he has repeatedly affirmed that he will lead the modern revolution until the formation of the “Aryan Mahestan = people’s congress for drafting a new constitution,” and thereafter will submit to the will of the people, the intelligence organization of Allah, by activating mercenaries kept “in reserve” and disguised as opposition figures, has implemented the British policy of “divide and rule.”

Manouk Khodabakhshian and the artist Shahrokh Shahid have declared and emphasized this, yet to this day the people have not been allowed to identify the hidden spies and infiltrators present in every corner.

Be vigilant and, as an example, read the following report carefully and circulate it widely.



Siyavash Awesta is the only enlightened thinker and writer whom the British government, in 1996 — at the peak of the global expansion of his ideas under the name Dr. Hassan Abbassi in Iran and worldwide — when his books were being reprinted in thousands of copies and he was writing in seven reputable Iranian and French newspapers as a member of their editorial boards, and when through Radio Avaye Iran in Paris, Mehr Television, and the Shahr-e Farang cultural center on the Champs-Élysées since 1983 he was fighting day and night in Persian, French, and Arabic against the racist, bloodthirsty, and terror-promoting regime of the mullahs — subjected in London to the official interrogation of “Mr. F.F.” and his family for distributing his works.

Mr. F.F., his wife, and his children were threatened with expulsion from the United Kingdom if they continued assisting Dr. Hassan Abbassi (Siyavash Awesta). The authorities reportedly stated: “We maintain good relations with the regime of the mullahs and do not wish to have disagreements with Iran because of another Salman Rushdie” (referring to Siyavash Awesta). At that time, coinciding with the assassination of Dr. Kourosch Aryamanesh (Awesta’s collaborator) in the Paris suburbs, Siyavash Awesta was traveling under the security protection of special French police commandos in a bulletproof vehicle.

An inquiry was conducted regarding the interrogation and threats against Mr. F.F.'s family in London; the information was confirmed by Mr. Parviz Esfahani, editor-in-chief of Nimrooz in London, and the British police reportedly issued an apology.

Simultaneously, through a so-called friend of Awesta (identified as "Mr. M.") on a television channel in Los Angeles, a terrorist commander of the Quds Force of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, whose real name was Yadollah Qazvini, was introduced under the name Dr. Hassan Abbassi as the chief advisor to Khamenei and founder/commander of Hamas.

Every day, dozens of times, the name Dr. Hassan Abbassi was repeated as commander of the Revolutionary Guards and Hamas on a satellite television channel broadcast worldwide — a channel originally created by Siyavash Awesta himself.

At one point, Yadollah Qazvini — who had been made famous as Dr. Hassan Abbassi and advisor to Khamenei — was imprisoned in Tehran due to conflicts with Mohammad Khatami's faction. Nevertheless, the infiltrated agent "Mr. M." in Los Angeles continued his propaganda without mentioning the imprisonment, broadcasting daily false information to damage the reputation of the real Hassan Abbassi, Siyavash Awesta.

Since worldwide only Siyavash Awesta was known under the name Dr. Hassan Abbassi — and no other Hassan Abbassi existed either in Iran or abroad — and beyond his media efforts he had been a member of the editorial board of Nimrooz for 22 years, publishing an article under that name in every issue, this defamation operation carried out by an agent of the mullahs was methodical and highly effective in brainwashing public opinion.

Even close friends and family members eventually believed it, especially since they were aware of the pre-revolutionary friendship between the Awesta family and the family of Ali Khamenei.

Many people subsequently approached Awesta to deliver messages or facilitate the release of their assets, believing he could mediate with Khamenei. The regime's Minister of Intelligence recently revealed in a lengthy interview with a journalist named Dehbashi that "Mr. M." was one of dozens of journalists spying for the mullahs in the United States, actively involved in marginalizing regime opponents in media, conducting espionage, and spreading propaganda

against serious opponents among Jews, Baha'is, the Mujahideen, and even within local police circles.

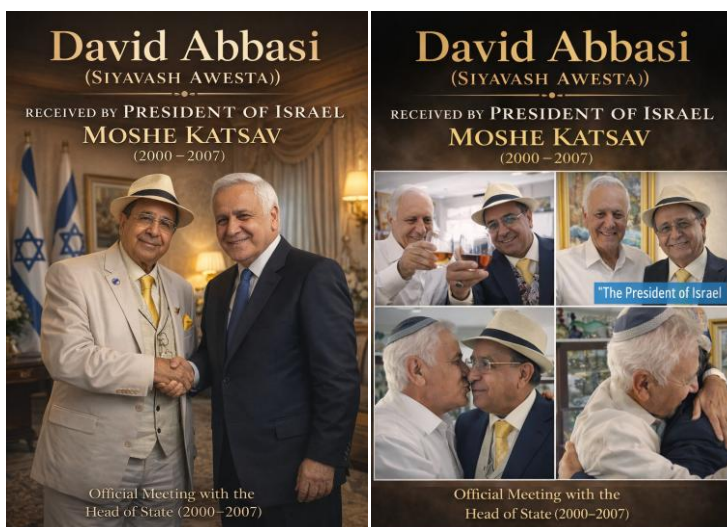
Manouk Khodabakhshian had specifically warned about this individual and about the regime's infiltration of media, stating that as long as this powerful media influence abroad is not destroyed, overthrowing the regime would be impossible.



This defamation campaign was so effective that even two of “Mr. M.’s” employers in Los Angeles believed it. Mr. Assadollah Morovati, a senator during the Shah’s era and owner of Radio Sedaye Iran in Los Angeles, once asked Awesta at dinner to intercede with Khamenei to recover properties worth several billions.

After discovering the defamation campaign, the late Asadollah Marvati dismissed his employee “Mr. M.” However, the regime later established in the United States, through an Iranian businessman (“Mr. B.N.”), a 24-hour radio station dedicated specifically to this agent, financed with several million dollars, distributing hundreds of receivers free of charge.

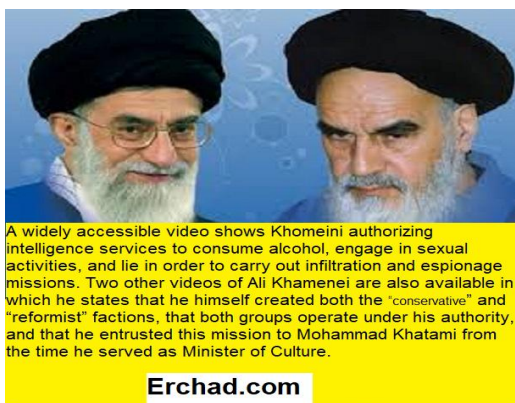
With the rise of satellite television, the radio was shut down and “Mr. M.” joined a satellite channel. Even the director of one of these channels, influenced by propaganda against Awesta, asked him to intercede with Khamenei for a family matter.



Dr. Nasr Esfahani, former Minister of the Interior during the monarchy, also stated on television during President Trump’s first term that Awesta was the chief advisor to Ali Khamenei — a claim for which he publicly apologized the following week after contact and police intervention.

The United States and Israel have repeatedly declared that the infiltration and psychological warfare conducted by the regime's security services are beyond imagination. During the presidency of Moshe Katsav (2000–2007), Israel enjoyed broader recognition and cooperation throughout the Arab and Muslim world, whereas in recent years a climate of racism and antisemitism fueled by the mullahs' dollars has spread widely.

Recently, two Iranian figures in France — one, a police chief named Mathieu Ghadiri, a former French spy within the regime's intelligence services, and the other, Emmanuel Razavi, a prominent investigative reporter — have revealed through books, articles, and interviews major information about the regime's intelligence infiltration worldwide, particularly in the West and especially in France.



A widely accessible video shows Khomeini authorizing intelligence services to consume alcohol, engage in sexual activities, and lie in order to carry out infiltration and espionage missions. Two other videos of Ali Khamenei are also available in which he states that he himself created both the "conservative" and "reformist" factions, that both groups operate under his authority, and that he entrusted this mission to Mohammad Khatami from the time he served as Minister of Culture.

According to numerous international media outlets and Persian-language press in Europe, North America, and the Middle East, and in a context marked by several assassinations of Persian figures opposed to the Iranian regime, David Abbasi, also known as Siyavash Awesta, benefited at various periods from close protection measures under the authority of the French Ministry of the Interior, including the use of secure vehicles, due to threats to his safety.
